# Appendix II: Examples

## Active transportation - walking, biking, and public transportation

- Bike racks and storage solutions
  - o Promote and encourage biking by making it easier and more accessible.
- Sidewalk and bike path improvements
  - o Promote walking by making it easier and more accessible.
- Signage, wayfinding signage
  - Use signage to make navigation on foot and bike easier and more enjoyable.
- Street furnishing
  - Permanent benches, planter boxes, trash cans, recycling bins.
  - Parklets: sidewalk extensions that provide more space and amenities for people using the street. This can include dining, garden, or recreational use.
- Crosswalks
  - Improving safety and appearance.
- Public transportation shelters
  - o Improving access, safety, shade, and appearance.

#### Safe and inclusive places - visibility and accessibility

- Lighting
  - Improving safety in recreational areas or along walking/biking routes
- High visibility enhancements
  - LED light, reflectors, reflector strips
- ADA accessibility improvements
  - Ramps, tactile warning surfaces
- Shading
  - Improve shade by constructing structures and/or trees

- Enhancing public space
  - Art Installations
  - o Murals
  - Sculptures
  - Street Art

## Physical activity, recreation, and trails

- Playgrounds and/or playground equipment
  - Adaptive and inclusive improvements
- Trail/path construction, additions, and improvements
  - Storybook strolls, fitness stations
- Recreational courts
- Fitness equipment
- Park or recreational area refurbishment

- Hydration stations indoor or outdoor
- Gardens
